

I draw and paint things as I see them. From these observations, I look for the feeling of light and space, heaviness and lightness in my work, I try to reduce it to the essentials. My paintings are often monochromatic or I use a limited color palette. By using only a few colors, each of them plays a meaningful role. An important place for my work has been Kökar (a municipality in the Åland archipelago in Finland), its changing color and light phenomena have taught me to see the world with new eyes. The nature of the island made an impression right from the first visit 2004. And the fact that the whole world, 360 degrees is around it, in the middle of the sea, the land under your feet within a radius of twenty kilometers. The island must be understood. Everything you take with you to the island must be brought off. I graduated with a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree 2013 from the Turku Art Academy. I am a member of the Painters' Union and take part in the Artist Register. I live and work in Pori, Finland.


"The Wander 61. Ink painting-suminagashi-collage is a part of a series of works created by intuition's guidance and painted almost expressively. When I am working, I am on a journey, letting the work itself tell which direction to go and what it wants to make visible in the picture. The wandering starts with the first brush stroke. You have to get color and shapes on paper and observe what kind of traces are created. You need to give a chance for finding something new. I work on several pieces at a time, starting new ones or finishing up other pieces while the others are drying and letting my eyes get a little break from them. This gives the works of art a sense of seriality, and just like in life, difficult parts find their solution – they have to be lived and worked through. At the core of my art is being human."

Visual artist Anne-Mari Heiskanen is a member of the Finnish Painters Union, the Finnish Printmarkers, Vyborg Artist Association and Finnish Watercolor Society. Heiskanen is a Master of Culture and Arts, graduated from the Imatra School of Visual Arts in Finland. Heiskanen has held solo exhibitions since 2002 and participated in many group exhibitions in Finland and abroad. This is her first exhibition in Japan.







I am a visual artist born in 1965, I work in Luumäki, in the attic of a small yellow house. My motto is: Humans see the world in colors, unlike many other mammals.



Klaus Könönen is an artist focusing on surrealist way of expressing the inner world of thoughts and dreams based on the vision of the real world around us. The subjects of his art are based also from the feelings of persived world and human emotions, but still the nature itself is the biggest influence, for example a very complex and surrealistic artwork have started off from a quick sketch of a house plant on a balcony when he sees more in it than just the obvious, a house plant. Klaus loves to create very detailed artwork where he uses picture within picture techniques as well as what he calls 360° art where the picture constantly changes as one turns it revealing new expressive pictures in the same place on the paper or canvas where the viewer just saw something else. He likes to surprise the viewer with these as he thinks this same happens in the real world as well, "so many things we see and experience in the world, if not all, is depending purely on the perspective and it is good to keep this in mind and challenge one's own to broaden the view and understanding of bigger picture." Klaus uses many different techniques in making his art works from traditional media, these days mainly felt ink pens (Sakura Pigma Micron), but also paints with acrylics and oils. On the other side he also uses digital platforms such as Photoshop and Procreate to paint and draw digitally. Also there will be collaboration of both traditional and digital installations in which he uses video to display movement to his art works. Klaus is also a professional technical diver, cave diver, underwater explorer and diving instructor and have absolute love towards the underwater world and everything within there from the life, the lifeless rock formations to the absolute feeling of weightlessness, like in space, which one can master with buoyancy control.







The paintings are disconnected from reality, although they include parts of reality loaded with symbolism and images. He likes to paint nocturnal topics. Maybe it can simply be said that he paints" the black light", because it is transparent. The night is not gloomy, but it is a distinctive world which you cannot see and reach in the daylight. However, the day breaks on his studies on nature. Daylight reveals the vulnerable nature with amazing powers.




